- 1.1 *Regular (Senior) – approved by Board, send copy of birth certificate to CAS Board, 90 years = age + years of service in SK; Regular (Non-resident) – approved by Board; Regular (Part-time/Medical leave) – send letter to CAS Board stating your intentions*
- 1.2 *Locum – approved by Board, send appropriate form and letter to CAS Board **Locum practitioners are required to pay **\$10 per day** to the maximum permitted (66 days), plus CCPA malpractice insurance or equivalent*
- 1.3 *Student – approved by Board*
- 1.4 *Limited – members who have not written and passed the Jurisprudence Ethics Exam*
- 1.5 *Granted by Board*

Note: all initial applications for Registration and the Jurisprudence Ethics Exam require a non-refundable fee of **\$300 in addition** to any yearly fee required.

Reinstatement Fees (non-refundable): \$500.00

FEE REDUCTION POLICIES

Members may apply for a reduction of CAS fees for the following:

Former Practicing Senior Member

Where the sum of a member's age and years of practice as a practicing regular member in Saskatchewan equals a minimum of 95, that member may apply in writing to the CAS Board for a reduction in annual licensing fees as specified in Appendix A of the Administrative Bylaws.

Application must be made on an annual basis.

Former Practicing Education Member

Where the member is attending classes in a duly accredited institution of higher learning, that member may apply in writing to the CAS Board for a reduction in fees as specified in Appendix A of the Administrative Bylaws. The Board will determine eligibility on the basis of the following criteria:

- the area of study is of benefit to the practitioner and the profession of chiropractic
- the studies are continuous, expeditiously pursued and not unnecessarily prolonged

Application must be made on an annual basis.

Former Practicing Part-Time Member

Where a member is working no more than twelve hours per week and seeing no more than fifty patients during this time period, that member may apply in writing to the CAS Board for a reduction in fees as specified in Appendix A of the Administrative Bylaws.

If the fee reduction is granted, the member will continue to provide sufficient written proof on a quarterly basis to the Board confirming that the member continues to be in compliance with the criteria for fee reduction. If it is determined that the member is no longer in compliance with the criteria for fee reduction, the Board will take such action as is required, including the retroactive revocation of the fee reduction, in which case the member would have to immediately pay all outstanding licensing fees for the appropriate membership category.

Application must be made on an annual basis.

Former Non-Practicing Associate Member

This membership category has been eliminated.

EDUCATION MEMBER ANNUAL FEES

[A Member may choose either of the following formulas]

FORMULA 1 (based on CAS portion only)

- A. Actual hours of practice per year (48 weeks) before enrolling in University = Z
- B. Hours in class per year = X
- C. Travel hours [only if class location is more than 32 km from office one way.]
- allow 1 hour for each 100 kms travelled, return, each day in class = Y
- D. Percentage reduction in fees = $\frac{X+Y}{Z}$

FORMULA II (based on CAS portion only)

- A. Actual DAYS of practice per year (48 weeks) before enrolling in University = Z
- B. Days in class per year (if only am or pm divide by 2 **unless** travel hours are more than 2) = X
- C. Travel hours [only allowed if class location is more than 32 km from office one way]
- allow 1 hour for each 62 miles (100 kms) travelled, return, each day in class = Y
- D. Percentage reduction in fees = $\frac{X+Y}{Z}$

EXAMPLE: 6 months covering 2 semesters = 130 days divided by 2 = 65 days in class divided by 240 days of practice (48 x 5) x 100 = 27%

$\frac{65+0}{240} = 27\%$ x \$1400 = \$378 reduction

NOTE: The Canadian Chiropractic Association has a membership category called 'Special Practicing' which our Education member could apply for resulting in a further reduction in fees. Currently this is a reduction of \$70.

FEE SCHEDULE DEFINITIONS

1. INITIAL VISIT

Shall comprise a full history of the presenting complaint, a detailed inquiry concerning the complaint and detailed examination of the affected part, region or system as required to:

- a) arrive at a diagnosis (functional or pathological);
- b) complete an appropriate record of findings;
- c) advise the patient on course of treatment;
- d) where appropriate, refer the patient for other health care;
- e) initiate treatment and /or advice.

2. REASSESSMENT

Shall comprise a history of a secondary or additional complaint, whether in conjunction with the initial assessment or at a later stage, and the necessary physical examination as required to:

- a) arrive at a diagnosis (functional or pathological);
- b) complete an appropriate record of findings;
- c) advise the patient on course of treatment;
- d) initiate treatment and /or advice

REASSESSMENT AND TREATMENT

Shall comprise a brief history and re-examination of the affected part or region, and appropriate record, and advice to the patient. A treatment or referral to another health care professional should also accompany this office visit.

3. TREATMENT AND FOLLOW-UP ASSESSMENT

Specific brief assessment of the current condition followed by specific manipulation and supportive therapy or adjunctive therapy as required. Notations should be made in progress notes.

4. & 5. EMERGENCY VISITS

This means after working hours call-back to either the office or a patient's house.

6. MODALITIES - those permitted in Saskatchewan are:

- ❖ Interferential Current Therapy
- ❖ Microelectrical Neuromuscular Stimulation
- ❖ TENS
- ❖ Shortwave Diathermy
- ❖ Therapeutic Ultrasound (*subject to regulations under the Radiation Health and Safety Act, 1985*)
- ❖ Muscle Stim
- ❖ Surface electromyography (S.E.M.G.)

Not permitted - laser.
